During the summer, it is very important to read, write, and practice your math skills. You will have three assignments to complete over the summer.

You will need to complete the Summer Math Book to review the math concepts you learned during first grade and to prepare you for second grade math. Be sure to practice your math facts, too!

From the books that you read this summer, please choose two of your favorite books to complete your book reports. For each book report you will need to neatly write at least five sentences telling about what happened in the book then draw a picture about the book using the attached forms. Be sure to color your picture. I will post copies of the book report templates on my BSS web page in case you need them.

The summer math book and two book reports are due on the first day of school, Monday, August  $26^{th}$ .

I encourage you to read EVERY DAY and keep a reading log. You can use the reading log I have provided or create one for yourself. This reading log is a helpful tool to keep track of your summer reading but is not required and does not need to be turned in on the first day of school.

To experience a wide variety of literature, I encourage students to read different types of books over the summer — nonfiction, fiction, fantasy, biography, poetry, or anything else you might be interested in reading. Check with your local librarian for suggestions and consider joining your local library's summer reading club. I have included a list of books in case you are looking for suggestions on what to read.
